The American Legion turned 105 on Friday, March 15 – the day in 1919 when the first American Legion caucus, held by members of the American Expeditionary Force, convened in Paris.

Each year, Legion posts across the country hold events – public, private or both – to commemorate this anniversary. Posts are encouraged to upload recaps and photos of their birthday celebrations (and other community activities) to <u>legiontown.org</u>.

A 105th birthday speech has been drafted by the Legion's Media and Communications staff as a way for Legionnaires to emphasize what the Legion represents, both to themselves and to the community at large. They are not meant to be recited verbatim; members are encouraged to amend them to taste and audience. The speech can be downloaded <u>here</u>.

As The American Legion prepares to celebrate its birthday, a perfect way to celebrate is to make Buddy Checks. The American Legion's Buddy Check program initially started for posts to conduct them twice a year — the week of American Legion Birthday and Veterans Day. Since the program has demonstrated success, posts conduct them year-round.

#### 'It's right to the heart': Sons, Legion Family lay wreaths to honor veterans

Standing before the granite column representing California at the World War II Memorial, Sons of The American Legion National Vice Commander James Fischer reflected on the veterans in his family.

"I'm here representing my grandfather, my father, my uncle who served in World War I, World War II and the Korean War (respectively), and I have two brothers who served in Desert Storm and my son served in Afghanistan," Fischer said. "... I was born on Memorial Day, and my grandfather was 70. He said I was God's gift to him; he lost his leg in World War I. Then when I got my contractor's license 31 years ago, I got it on Pearl Harbor Day even though I tested in August.

"Everything in my life has been reminders of the importance we have taking care of our veterans."

Sons of The American Legion, Legionnaires and Auxiliary members from across the nation participated in wreathlaying ceremonies around Washington, D.C., on Feb. 25 during the Legion's annual Washington Conference. They were joined by Samsung American Legion scholarship recipients.

It's been a regular event for the SAL, but SAL National Commander Don "JR" Hall reminded participants to not think of the event as routine.

"I hope you didn't come out for any other reason than who you represent," Hall said. "... Think about it as this year, this time, this moment, and make sure that when those wreaths are being laid, you're saluting the service of your family. You're saluting the service of our veterans. You're saluting our flag, and you're saluting the United States of America. That's why we're here."

The opportunity to honor veterans helped bring Detachment of New Hampshire Commander Scott Douglas to the event for the first time.

"This means a lot to me ... my father was in World War II and the Korean War, so for me to come here from New Hampshire to Washington and to get to lay a wreath out in his name ... it's right to the heart," Douglas said.

The SAL and other Legion Family members laid wreaths at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier at Arlington National Cemetery and the Vietnam, Korean War and World War II memorials at the National Mall.

"You realize how much others have given for what we have," said Marty Widmer, a member of Squadron 262 in Audubon, N.J., and the Camden County SAL chaplain after the wreath-laying at Arlington.

A contingent from Florida also stopped at the Vietnam Women's Memorial to lay a wreath.

"It gives your whole body chills to know all this has happened before you, and having a moment where you can just take a moment, pay your respects ... it's kind of overwhelming the way your body feels," said Department of Florida legislative chair Stuart Scott.

For Charles Curtis, a member of Squadron 283 in Pacific Palisades, Calif., and the SAL national legislative commission, the memorials are "breathtaking."

"This one means a lot to me," Curtis said at the World War II Memorial. "Both of my grandfathers served during World War II. One was in the press corps, and he actually met my grandmother in Italy. My other grandfather served in Army intelligence, so we didn't really get to know a lot from him.

"I'm here today representing more than me. I'm representing both of them and thanking them for their service. These monuments are breathtaking and it's unfortunate that not everyone can come here for whatever reason. Being able to be here means so much, I really can't put it into words."

# Here's why you should join the SAL

In Matt Chastain's experience through 25 years in the communications industry, the best way to communicate with someone is to tell a story.

So when he was asked to figure out a way to help grow membership in the Sons of The American Legion, it was the story of how he became an SAL member that he drew upon.

The result: videos depicting how Chastain came to join Squadron 123 at James T. Rayle Post 123 in Lexington, Ga. Those videos can be used by squadrons, posts and others to highlight the SAL and what it means to be a member.

Chastain credits George Gray, the former squadron adjutant and Detachment of Georgia commander, for selling him on the SAL.

"George is exactly who he is depicted to be in the video and *more*. If every community, every post, every squadron just had a few Georges, the world would be a better place!" Chastain said. "When George believes in something as much as he does the mission of the SAL, he gives it everything he has. So he's always recruiting."

The video depicts Gray first talking with Chastain at a cookout. While Chastain accepted the membership application Gray gave him, he admits he forgot about it.

A few months later, Chastain's friend Jesse invites him to karaoke at Post 123. This time, Chastain signs up.

For reenacting that part of the story for the video, Jesse wasn't available. "So another buddy of mine played the role of Jesse. He was only there for maybe two hours but before he left, George had recruited him to join the SAL!

"All this to say that George never stops recruiting and when I was asked to come up with an idea for a recruitment video, I thought that there's no more effective communication tool than storytelling, so why not just tell a true story?"

In talking about why membership in the SAL is important, Chastain brought up another story.

"Back before Christmas, I had the honor of participating in a Flags Across America event put on by our local American Legion and SAL in conjunction with my son's Trail Life USA troop. Of course it was amazing to hear from a handful of local veterans and family members of fallen heroes. It was also rewarding for Legion/SAL members and Trail Life boys to work together laying wreaths.

"But at the end of the event, I got into a conversation with a young veteran who had lost eight of his fellow veterans to suicide. Hearing his story of how difficult life can be — especially disabled vets like him — gave me such a better perspective on why organizations like The Legion and SAL do what they do. America's heritage must be preserved if our country is to be preserved. There's no better way to preserve our heritage than to serve the men and women who fought to protect it."

(21 MARCH 2024) – BELLEVILLE, NJ – At the Department Commander's Official Visit to Essex County, the officers of the newly created Sons of the American Legion (SAL) Essex County Executive Committee were installed last week at Post 105 in Belleville.

The Department, or state level, American Legion makes an official visit to each of New Jersey's 21 counties throughout the year, where the Department Commander and his leadership team meet the members of the Posts, Units, and Squadron which make up the local American Legion. March was Department Commander Larry Bishop's official visit to Essex, and joining him were

Department American Legion Auxiliary President Sharon Knight, and SAL Detachment Commander Keith Barnes. These three officers, who preside over the approximately 30,000 American Legion Family members in New Jersey, took office in June 2023 and end their term after the Wildwood Convention during the second week of June 2024.

At that March county meeting, SAL Detachment Commander Barnes installed the newly elected officers of the SAL Essex County Executive Committee, which was officially created in the first week of March. In what has been years in the making, the County Committee mirrors what many other counties throughout NJ already have established – an organization made up of representatives from squadrons throughout the county, which meet together in caucus

monthly to administer, guide, and assist their fellow squadrons. The county committee is a key element in the successful operation of the organization, and serves as a conduit of communication between state-level initiatives and priorities and the local squadrons.

The creation of a county organization in Essex is a big deal, as one hasn't existed in perhaps 20 years. In fact, the only National Commander of the Sons of the American Legion to ever come from New Jersey was from Essex County in 1980 – National Commander Ernest Wilson of Newark's Squadron 152.

The SAL Essex County Committee is made up of the four active squadrons in the county – Squadron 70 of Nutley, Squadron 73 of East Orange, Squadron 105 of Belleville, and Squadron 185 of Caldwell.

Officers installed that day included County Commander Steve Sangemino (Belleville 105), County Vice Commander Kevin Infield (Nutley 70), County Adjutant Richard Vlasakakis (Belleville 105), and County Sgt-at-Arms Ken Ackerman (Nutley 70). Other officers include County Chaplain Robert K. Krupinski (Nutley 70), who is a dual member and a Marine Corps veteran himself, and Detachment Executive Committeeman James Elsmore (Belleville 105). The current DEC is Rusty Myers, also of Belleville 105, whose term ends in June at which point Elsmore will then serve for the three-year term. Myers also serves as the new County Judge Advocate.

The SAL Committee Chairman appointed by the American Legion Essex County Executive Committee is Henry DelTosto (Nutley 70), an Army veteran, Nutley Post 70 Past Commander, and Adjutant for the American Legion Essex County.

#### Cesar Romero, Jersey Shore WW2 Veteran

Good afternoon, folks. I'd like to wish a Very Happy 117th Birthday (15-Feb) to another famous kid from the Jersey Shore, actor Cesar Romero!

Wait, what? He's from Jersey?! Yes! Little known fact, although born in New York City on (Thursday) Feb. 15th, 1907, the handsome, mustachioed star grew up in Bradley Beach, and also attended Asbury Park High School, both here in Monmouth County.

Already a famous actor by the early 1940's (such as his role in 1937's "Wee Willie Winkie," opposite Shirley Temple), Cesar, like so many other stars, answered the Nation's Call for World War 2.

He enlisted in the US Coast Guard on Oct.12th, 1942, and went on to fight in the South Pacific on board the USS Cavalier (AP-82/APA-37), a Bayfield-Class attack transport. Shunning the spotlight, Cesar embedded himself as just another member of the crew. By war's end, he had been promoted to Chief Petty Officer.

Postwar, he would return to Hollywood, and go on to a long and memorable Hollywood career, notably as the mischievous and scheming Marquis Andre "Uncle Andy" de Lage, opposite John Wayne and Lee Marvin in the 1963 comedy "Donovan's Reef," as well as the psychopathic (and absolutely terrifying) villain 'The Joker' in the 1966-68 TV Show "Batman," opposite Adam West.

Cesar Romero passed away on New Years Day, 1994, aged 86, and is buried in Englewood, CA.


Gone, but never forgotten. Not only as an actor, but certainly as an American Veteran of WW2, and part of the history of the Garden State.

<u>A Jersey Connection</u>: The frames of early WW2 RADAR units rode the Central RR of NJ rails from Western Electric in Kearny to Sandy Hook, where electronic systems were added. Then the units rolled south to Avon-by-the-Sea. In the Ferguson Plumbing Supply building, the secret Identification Friend or Foe (IFF) units were added. Then the units were shipped by rail to major US coastal cities for protection from enemy attack or ports for shipment to battle zones.
